















Wealth in the United Kingdom

- 100 billionaires




Philanthropy Landscape

- \bullet Philanthropy in the UK has its roots from the 1300s
- CASE Europe founded 1994
- \bullet Prospect researchers at Oxford University in mid 1980s
- * over 180,000 registered charities plus countless small ones (income under £5,000)
- "Charities" is the term used for all nonprofits, but universities tend to be discussed somewhat separately

Philanthropy

- * People and companies in the UK give about £13 billion per year to charities. (Cass Centre on Giving and Philanthropy)
- People give about £9 billion of that
- * Independent trusts and foundations make charitable grants of around £3 billion per year (CCGAP)
- • Giving to universities surpassed £1 billion last year for $1^{\rm st}$ time (Ross-CASE)
- * $\sim\!2,\!100$ fundraising and alumni relations officers working in UK university development
- Over 800,000 people working in charity sector
